Any category with three entries or more will be awarded prizes. Fours, quads, singles, doubles, pairs, rec-shells all welcome. This 3-mile stake race will start and finish at Sellwood Riverfront Park. Simple head race style format, timed with our own stop watches backed up by a sophisticated computer program. Doubling up on events is encouraged, but we will stick to the schedule.

The PERPETUAL SILVER TROPHIES will be awarded to the fastest man and woman 1x. First, second and third places from each category with at least three boats will carry home a unique award. The highlight of the award ceremony is the BEST OF BREED trophy. This special trophy is decided by the previous year's winner and is given to the person (or persons) who race in the most creative costume/ show collar/ whatever. Plan ahead for this one and carry home this valuable prize. You don't even have to train!
