# BEFORE DECIDING ON ENTRIES PLEASE READ ALL THE INFORMATION BELOW!!!!

The Regatta values the participation of both college and high school athletes, and has made these changes to allow participation by both groups of athletes while not jeopardizing their ability to compete in future intercollegiate contests. These additions are limited to women's event divisions only. The restrictions apply to US high school students participating in both school AND club based programs.

# These rules are in addition to the General Entry Rules:

Changes

**Open Fours/Eights Women:** No person (coxswain included) enrolled in high school.

Lightweight Fours/Eights Women: No person (coxswain included) enrolled in high school.

Novice Fours/Eights Women: No person (coxswain included) enrolled in high school.

**Open Single/Pair/Double Women:** Entries where one or both of the rowers are enrolled in high school must notify the regatta and will start separately from other entries.

**Seeding/Starting Order:**...Seeding of all women's sculling events and the women's pair will follow the same procedures as last year except for those considered "youth" entries. These entries would be boats where one or both of the rowers are enrolled in high school. These entries will start after all other entries.

# NCAA Bylaw 13.11.1.2 Competition Against Prospective Student Athletes

**13.11.1.2 Competition Against Prospective Student-Athletes.** An institution's varsity intercollegiate team may compete against a two-year college team but may not compete against a high school or preparatory school team. An institution's varsity team may not participate in a contest against an established outside team (e.g., non-scholastic team) that includes high school prospective student-athletes except for permissible contests while on a foreign tour, exempted contests against a foreign team in the United States and the United States national team. Sub-varsity teams are not bound by this prohibition.

#### I. ENTRIES

#### A. Registration:

#### B. Entry Fees:

#### B. Entry Deadline:

The deadline to register at <u>http://www.regattacentral.com/</u> Friday, October 20 2006.

# Note: If you are to enter a race after the deadline your boat will be added at the end of the race. We will be doing a random draw this year on Monday, October 23, 2006.

Your line-ups will be due on race day.

#### C. Notes:

- 1. MINIMUM entries required: Any event which receives less than three (3) entries will be cancelled.
- We will only add events if there is sufficient interest indicated, if minimum entries required are met, <u>AND</u> if an event is cancelled (see #1) opening a time slot. We <u>WILL NOT</u> "squeeze" additional races into our schedule. Please contact the Regatta Director if you are interested in an event that's not currently listed.
- 3. When deciding on your entries keep in mind that we will **NOT WAIT** for people hotseating. Do not attempt to enter any event with the same equipment or crew with less than **90 minutes** between events. You <u>must</u> be in the starting area 5 minutes before the start of your race.
- 4. All crews must be capable of finishing the 2.5 mile downstream course in under 35 minutes.

# II. DEFINITIONS AND ELIGIBILITY RULES

#### A. Rules

USRowing rules of racing will govern all situations unless otherwise specified within. Please refer to the Course Description and Procedures sheet for specific racing rules.

#### B. Event Specifications:

#### 1. Novice

Any competitor who is in their 1<sup>st</sup> year of collegiate rowing OR who has been competing for one year or less as of October 29, 2006. This means experienced college freshmen may compete. Experience as a sculler does not count as experience in sweep events and vice versa.

#### 2. Masters

Must be at least 27 years of age on the Regatta date. The classes are as follows: (Please be sure and put your age down on the line-up sheet—this is very important to have ahead of time. There is no computer available the day of the race)

Elite	27+
Masters	37+
Senior	48+
Veteran	60+

# 3. Lightweights

Men = 165 pounds maximum, no average Women = 133 pounds maximum, no average **Note:** You will find the weigh-in procedure in Section III, part G.

#### 4. Mixed Crew

Must have equal number of male and female rowers in the boat.

#### 5. Coxswain:

No Restrictions.

#### 6. Junior:

A junior is a competitor who in the current calendar year does not attain the age of 19, or who is and has been continuously enrolled in secondary school as a full-time student seeking a diploma.

# III. REGATTA INFORMATION

#### A. Accommodations

There will be floor space available for teams at the Field House at The University of Iowa, free of charge. But you will be required to pay for parking. Please contact Kendra Wieditz, if you are interested in the Field House accommodations by Friday, October 20, 2006. We will cancel the room if there are no interested teams.

#### B. Boat Storage/Parking

Boats may be stored at the race site in the sectioned-off area near the East parking lot at City Park. There will be professional security provided for Saturday night. Please indicate on your Composite Entry Form the day you will arrive in Iowa City. Boats may be stored from Saturday starting at 10:00 am.

#### C. Concessions & Hospitality

Vendors will be at the site all day.

#### D. Meetings

There will be a coaches and coxswains meeting at 7:30 a.m. on Sunday, October 29, 2006 outside the Registration Tent. All organizations <u>must</u> have a representative present for safety and scheduling reasons. Every organization will be responsible for the information presented at this meeting.

#### E. Practice

Teams will be allowed to practice from 12:00-5:00 pm on Saturday, October 28. **The dock** will close at 4:45 pm and all boats must be off the river at 5:30 pm. NO EXCEPTIONS!

#### F. Registration

Registration will take place Saturday, October 28 from 2:00-6:00 pm and Sunday, October 29 from 6:00-11:00 am in the Registration Tent at City Park.

#### G. Results and Awards

Medals will be awarded to the top 3 finishes in the events hosting 4 or more entries. A medal will be awarded to the top finisher in the events hosting 3 or less entries. Results will be posted as soon as possible. Starting at **11:00 am** you will be able to start picking up your awards. Awards will be presented throughout the day.

#### H. Weigh-In Procedure

- 1. Each athlete weighs in two hours before their first race of the day.
- 2. Doubling in events does not require re-weighing.
- 3. Lightweight crews must arrive together.
- 4. Each person must have a photo ID at the weigh-in site.
- 5. Weigh-ins are to be in racing attire: t-shirts and shorts (or unisuit).
- 6. Athletes must be within two pounds of the required weight on the first try or they will not be allowed to weigh in again. If they are within two pounds they are allowed to return up to two additional times during the two hour time period after the other crews have all taken their first opportunities. The entire crew will receive certification at the same time although they do not have to re-weigh those already at weight.
- 7. The scale will be available for the rowers to check their weight the day before. The scale will be at the Regatta site on Saturday, October 28, starting at 2:00 p.m.

#### HEAD OF THE IOWA COURSE DESCRIPTION & PROCEDURES

#### Launching Procedures

- 1. Crews must launch during the assigned launch time.
- 2. Launching will be in bow number order. Each crew must follow the direction of the dockmaster as to which dock to use. <u>Primarily</u>, the north dock will be used for launching and the south docks will be for returning crews.
- 3. Each crew must launch in two (2) minutes.
- 4. No rigging or stretcher adjustments at the dock. Equipment breakage: If crews experience equipment breakage at the dock, the dockmaster must be notified at once, and the shell shall be removed from the water immediately.
- 5. Hot-seating is permitted provided the entire crew for the next event is ready and waiting for the returning shell. If the crew is not immediately available, the shell must return to the staging area. Do no attempt to enter with the same equipment or crew with less than 90 minutes between events. If you are hotseating your boat, you must have yellow tape on the bow # and the coxswain must have a yellow glove. You must have red tape on the bow # if only a person is hotseating. *THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT SINCE WE WILL BE DOING THE DRAW A WEEK AHEAD OF TIME. NEED TO KNOW THIS BY OCTOBER 20, 2006.*
- 6. After launching, shells must proceed upstream from the launch area to the start line. Stay on the west and south side of the river.
- 7. The dockmaster will retain final authority regarding the launch and retrieval order of all shells.

# Rowing to the Start

- 1. You must allow a minimum of 30 minutes to get to the starting line from the docks.
- 2. Crews have approximately 3000 M in which to warm-up.
- 3. Crews must proceed to the start on the west and south side of the river.
- 4. The river will be bisected by <u>orange bema buoys</u> with the north and east side being the racing lane. Your oars should <u>never</u> go into the racing lane.
- 5. Crews must stay to the west and south shore as they proceed up-river to the start. Do not interfere with any race in progress. It may result in exclusion. Please stay in single file in the warm-up lane.
- 6. Once crews arrive at the starting area, they MUST follow the instructions of the race marshall on the water. Pay close attention to the marshall's instructions.
- 7. All crews should await the start of their race on the south side of the river. See the area marked "gathering area" on the enclosed map. Crews must be on full alert and in the "gathering area" on the south and west shore 5 minutes before their race begins.

# Rules at the Start

- 1. All crews must be up-river no later than five (5) minutes before the scheduled start of their event.
- 2. Each crew must be prepared to start at its assigned starting time. The starting order <u>WILL</u> follow numerical sequence of the bow-markers.
- 3. Each crew must follow the directions of the starting judge when proceeding to the starting line.
- 4. All crews must assist in maintaining order at the start. Be alert for other crews.
- 5. Shells arriving more than one (1) minute after the last boat has started WILL NOT be permitted to row for awards. Shells arriving more than ten (10) minutes after the start of the last competing boat in that event WILL NOT be permitted to row the course.

# **Rules During the Race**

- 1. The Head of the Iowa is a USRowing sanctioned event and will be run according to USRowing rules.
- 2. All crews must pass through the bridge spans marked with green banners. Failure to pass through the appropriate spans will result in exclusion. The Park Street Bridge and Hancher Footbridge each have spans to pass through. Prior to the Park Street Bridge (150 meters) is designated as a "No passing zone". This will be clearly marked with different colored buoys all the way to the bridge. For the safety of all crews—do not pass in this area!
- 3. Right of Way: A crew is deemed to be overtaking another crew when it has moved to within one boat length of open water of the crew ahead. A crew being overtaken shall move out of the way, to port, and allow the overtaking crew to pass to starboard. Do not force another crew to row directly in your wake after passing. Due to the narrow nature of the lowa River, all boats must hold their position when going under a bridge. Any boat failing to follow these rules or any other rules, will be excluded.
- 4. Due to the narrow nature of the river <u>your entire boat</u>, <u>including your blades</u>, must be to the port side of the buoys at all times. Failure to do so will result in penalties.

#### The Finish

The official order of finish will be determined in the timing tent. **Competitors must row through the buoyed markers at the finish line and through the 2<sup>nd</sup> from the left span of the railroad bridge.** Once through the railroad bridge turn immediately and quickly to proceed up-river on the west side. Do not go under the lowa Avenue Bridge (the one past the railroad bridge) because of the dam located 300 M down the river.

# **Returning to City Park**

Row upstream on the west side of the river to Hancher Auditorium. At this point wait for the
officials' clearance to move through the shallows, up through Park Street Bridge to the retrieval
dock. Be alert and do not interfere with any race in progress; it could result in exclusion
of your boat.

#### Protests

- 1. All protests must be filed within 60 minutes of the end of the race in which the violation occurred. The crew's coxswain or representative rower/sculler shall indicate the crew's **intent** to file a protest to the course marshall at the finish line or to the dockmaster on shore at the docks/launching area.
- 2. Protest forms must be filed directly with Roger Frederick, the Chief Referee.
- 3. A \$25 filing fee is required at the time a protest is filed. In the event the protest is upheld, the fee will be returned. If the protest is denied, the fee will be forfeited.

# Violations/Penalties

**Buoy Violations:** 

10 seconds for the 1<sup>st</sup> buoy

60 seconds for the 2<sup>nd</sup> buoy

Exclusion from the race for the third buoy

60 second penalties for the following:

Taking more than 2 minutes to launch from the dock

Late arrival to the start

Not yielding to another crew

Interference with a racing crew

Exclusion if you:

Try to pass another crew under the bridges or try to pass a crew in the "No passing zone" Are rowing with the wrong bow #

Cause a collision

Fail to use the appropriate spans of each bridge
