Updates in the Registration Process

There are several updates in the registration process since the 2018 NWIRA Championship Regatta.

- Registration for the 2019 NWIRA Championship Regatta will be done on the Regatta Central
 legacy platform, the platform for regattas held in the United States and other countries outside of
 Canada. All transactions in Regatta Central will be in Canadian Dollars, not US Dollars. Regatta
 Central will accept US credit/debit cards. Please be aware that US Dollar credit/debit card holders
 will see a <u>foreign exchange fees</u> on their statements when paying the NWIRA entries, regatta and
 association fees online in Regatta Central.
- As they did in 2018, Rowing Canada Aviron (RCA) is charging a seat fee of \$3.25 (Canadian Dollar) per race event in all 2019 RCA sanctioned Canadian regattas. This fee will appear in each event when Clubs register their entries in Regatta Central. All seat fees collected for this regatta go directly to RCA and not to NWIRA. Thus, all participating clubs will bear the full cost of the seat fee.
- Entry fees and regatta fees are the same as previous years except they are stated in Canadian dollars equivalent.
- Association and Guest Clubs will be able to pay association fees and guest club fees online in Regatta Central.
- To ensure smooth registration process for the NWIRA, athletes should be entered in their respective rowing association roster list (i.e., US Rowing Association and Rowing Canada Aviron) before entering the same athletes to events in the regatta. Regatta Central has implemented a process to pull in athletes registered with RCA and USRA.

NWIRA Registration Process

Entries are due by Friday, August 16, 2019.

NWIRA association clubs and guest clubs can submit their entries at the Regatta Central website - Regatta Central starting on Tuesday, July 23, 2019. The online registration will close at 12:00 a.m. Midnight (Central Time) on **Friday, August 16, 2019.** Entries will not be visible in Regatta Central until after close of registration.

Clubs that are not member of the NWIRA association may participate in this regatta as a guest club.

From Friday, August 16, 2019 until Monday, August 19, 2019 at 5:00 p.m. Central Time, clubs can submit name changes and/or scratches to the NWIRA Secretary, stock041@tc.umn.edu at no cost. Do not submit changes and/or scratches through Regatta Central during this period. The Secretary will not accept any new entries after the August 16 deadline.

The NWIRA Secretary will publish the event schedule and heat draws by **Wednesday, August 21, 2019.**

Clubs will need the following information to prepare their club 2019 NWIRA entries in Regatta Central:

- Competitor list which includes first and last name of rowers and coxswains
- Competitors' birthdates
- Crew entries, including crew names, coxswain, if needed, event #and name, boat ID (i.e. A, B, C)

Clubs are not required to enter alternates for each boat entry.

All US competitors should be an individual member of US Rowing Association and all Canadian competitors should be a member of Rowing Canada Aviron (RCA).

^{*} Any scratch fees NOT paid at the regatta will be subject to an administration fee (\$50 USD \$67 CAD).

** All rowers, including coxswains, competing in the championship regatta <u>are required</u> to pay the regatta fee (\$25 UD / \$33 CAD) in addition to boat entry fees and guest clubs fees or club membership dues. This regatta fee covers regatta expenses (e.g. banquet, insurance, entertainment, and equipment rental).

Non-rowers (parents, family members and friends) that wish to attend the awards banquet may do so at (\$25 USD / \$33 CAD) per person. Umpires and coaches will receive a complimentary ticket.

Clubs will be able to select the number of rowers (including coxswains) and non-rowers in the Regatta Central registration form under the <u>Additional Information and Option</u> section (see screen shot on next page). Make sure you select the appropriate number for rowers and non-rowers. After submitting the numbers in Regatta Central, clubs are responsible for the number of people expected to attend. There will be no refund for those who are unable to attend the award banquet.

*** Clubs can pay the Guest Club Fees (\$50 USD / \$67 CAD) or NWIRA Association Fees (\$100 USD / \$133 CAD) through Regatta Central under the <u>Additional Information and Options</u> section in the registration form. Make sure you select appropriate affiliate fees.

Payment Process

US and Canadian clubs can pay the following fees either (1) online in Regatta Central or (2) by turning in a check at the coaches meeting on Thursday, August 22, 2019, at 6:00 p.m. (Central Time) at the KRC boathouse.

> RCA Seat Fees. As mentioned earlier, this fee will go directly to RCA.

- > Regatta Fees for individuals (rowers and non-rowers) attending the awards banquet.


Regatta Central will take Canadian and US credit/debit card. As noted, US Dollar credit/debit card holders will see a <u>foreign exchange fees</u> on their statements when paying the NWIRA entries, regatta and association fees online in Regatta Central.

If you are not paying by credit/debit card at Regatta Central, please make your check payable to North Western International Rowing Association (NWIRA) in currency of the country of <u>your</u> club. If US clubs wish pay their invoice in Canadian Dollars, they may do so.

The Secretary will send out final invoice out to club representatives entered in Regatta Central by Tuesday, August 20, 2019.

Club with outstanding balance on the first day of the regatta will not be allow to compete until the balance is paid in full or other arrangement has been made.

At the bottom of the Registration page in Regatta Central, club can pay their association fees or guest club fees as well as regatta fees for rowers, coxswains, and non-rowers. Please contact Regatta Central if a club need to purchase regatta fees for more than 150 rowers.

Entry Rules

Double and Pair events limit to four entries per club

Each club may submit up to four entries for each double and pair event. This includes the following events:

The purpose of this rule to reduce the number of heats needed to race these events.

➤ An event with one or more entries from only one club after close of registration

If an event has one or more entries from only one club after close of registration, the event will stay on the schedule. At the coaches' meeting, clubs will have opportunity to submit entries to the event. Clubs submitting entries will pay normal entry fees for that event.

If the event does not receive entries from any other clubs at the coaches' meeting, NWIRA will cancel that event and refund the entry fees to the club with the entries.

- To be eligible to row in the Championship regatta, a competitor must register as a competitive member of a club for which he/she will compete for. A competitor cannot row as unaffiliated.
- Individuals are eligible to row for one club during the Championship regatta and that must the only Club that the rower competed for after June 15th of the current year.
- Composite crews are not allowed in this Championship Regatta.

Rower Classifications

Junior B/U17	An individual who will be 16 or under on December 31, 2019.
Junior/U19	An individual who in the current calendar year does not attain the age of 19, or who is and has been continuously enrolled in secondary school as a full time student seeking a diploma.
	An individual cease to be a Junior after December 31 of the year of his or her 18th birthday, or of the year in which he or she completes the 12th grade of secondary school, having been a full time student, whichever is later.
Open	All individuals are eligible for Open events. Individuals rowing in Open events cannot row in Master's events.

Masters An individual who has attained or will attain the age of 27 or older on

December 31, 2019. An individual age is determined as of December 31, 2019. Crew's average age is rounded down to the nearest whole number.

Masters will be age adjusted based on Rowing Canada Aviron Garrett Masters' Age Adjusted Time System.

All masters entering master's events can only row Master events, Dashes, and Open 8+ events.

Lt. Weight Women No crewmember shall be over 130 lbs – 59.0 kg.

Lt. Weight Men No crewmember shall be over 159.8 lbs – 72.5 kg.

A crew competing in a mixed event must be 50% male and 50% female, not including the coxswain. A female rower shall not compete in events for men, and a male rower shall not compete in events for women.

With the exception of the Junior 8+ events, all Master, Junior B/U17, Junior/U19, and Open rowers may row in any 8+ events.

NWIRA Volunteer Duty

NWIRA Association club needs to provide volunteers to work at the regatta, about one volunteer for every six athletes participating in the regatta. Volunteer shifts will primarily be 6 hours per shift but some shorter shifts may be available. Shift times may vary slightly based on the number of races and participants.

The LOC (Kenora Rowing Club) will be utilizing a Volunteer Software Management program to have volunteers register for their shift and review descriptions of the jobs and requirements. Most of the positions that the LOC will be asking for volunteers are stakeboat holders, boat drivers, and finish line personnel. A link to the Volunteer Software Management will be provided in an email to the participating clubs when registration opens.

While guest clubs are not required to provide volunteers, they are open to register to volunteer for a position. All volunteer spots will be filled on a first come basis.

Chief Referee

The chief referee for the 2019 NWIRA Championship Regatta is Sandi Kirby, RCA. RCA Rules of Rowing will govern this regatta.

Weather Contingency Plan

To ensure the safety of the athletes, officials, regatta personnel and volunteers, officials and LOC may shorten, reschedule, or cancel races due to deteriorating weather conditions or other unforeseen events. When such situations occur, the Chief Referee, NWIRA Executive Committee, and LOC Regatta Chair will jointly assess the situation, outline alternations to the race schedule or competition, and inform the participating clubs of the alternations. Such announcements will made over the on-site public address system and, if needed, ad-hoc meeting with coaches and club representatives.

Depending on the situation during the regatta, such alternations may include one or more of the following:

- > Shorten the race from 2000 meters to 1000 meters or shorter if the weather conditions deteriorate enough to cause choppy waters or the regatta is seriously behind schedule.
- Postpone or reschedule races to different time to allow thunderstorm, lightening or other severe weather conditions to pass through.
- Shorten or cancel finals if severe weather condition occurs in the afternoon. All finishing times from heats for an event determines finish order if finals are canceled.
- Rearrange races so that the big boat events (4-,4+, and 8+) are conducted first following a passing thunderstorm. Conduct the small boat events (1x, 2x, 2-) as conditions improved.
- Cancel one day of competition all together if severe weather condition lingers throughout the day. Run the second day of competition as scheduled if condition improves.

Officials, NWIRA Executive and LOC Regatta Chair may also consider other alternations not listed. Regardless of alternations implemented, the safety of the athletes, officials, regatta personnel, and volunteers is top priority under any severe weather situation or unforeseen events.

Club are responsible for staying updated on announced schedule and/or competition changes.

There will be no refund of entry fees, scratch fees, regatta fees, and association dues for canceled races due to deteriorating weather conditions or other unforeseen events.

Course and Event Distance

The course is a 2000 meter, 7-lane, fully buoyed course with stakeboats. Crews must be able to back into a stakeboat. All races will start from the starting line at the west end of the lake. See course map.

Event distances are as follow:

Waiver

Waiver is not required in this championship regatta.

Maximum Number of Events

Rowers may compete up to six events that he or she is eligible to row. Dashes are not included in this limit. If a rower violates this limit, the rower shall forfeit all medals won. In addition, the boat in violation will forfeit its medals, and any points earned by the offending crew.

Lane Assignments

Lane assignment for heats and final only are randomly drawn. Lane assignment for rowers advancing from heats are seeded base on place and time and assigned from middle lanes out.

NWIRA Progression System

Coxswains

- Coxswains must not weigh less than 120 lbs 54.4 kg for men's boats, 110 lbs 49.9 kg for women's boats, and 110 lbs 49.9 kg for mixed boats. Coxswains must weigh in ONCE for the entire regatta.
- Coxswains who weigh less than the required minimum MUST carry weight. Coxswains are responsible for securing their own weights. Regatta site may have materials for weights.

Weigh-Ins

• Weigh-ins shall be open for at least one and one-half hours and will end one-half hour before the first light weight race on the first day of the regatta. Weigh-in on first day of the regatta applies

for lightweight events on both days of the regatta, Friday and Saturday.

- Coaches must accompany their crews and coxswains for weigh-ins. <u>Pair and Double teams MUST weigh-in together.</u>
- If a male weighs in more than three pounds (1.36 kg) or a female weighs in more than two and a half pounds (1.14 kg) over the maximum weight for lightweights, that individual is disqualified from the lightweight events for the regatta.
- ALL CREWS AND COXSWAINS MUST BE IN CLUB ATTIRE FOR WEIGH-INS, DRESSED AS TO COMPETE IN A RACE NO EXCEPTIONS! <u>Athletes not in racing attire are not to weigh-in.</u> An athlete has only <u>two</u> attempts to make weigh on the first day of the regatta, provided he/she is not over the maximum allowed weight. There will be no "practice weigh-ins" on official scale.
- A test scale that is identical to the official scale is available for athletes to check their weight.
- Not making weight results a scratched entry and scratch fee.
- There is no average weight for lightweight crews.

Club Colors

All crews must wear their club colors during races or they will not be allowed to start any race.

Bow Balls and Bow Markers

All crews are required to have a bow ball on their shell. NWIRA will have standard size bow markers available for shells. Each boat must have a proper lane marker clip on the bow.

Heel Ties

All stretcher shoes must have proper length heel-restraining ties in place. Dock master will inspect shells before they are launch.

Foot Stretchers

RCA has updated rules for foot stretchers.

- Laces in rowing shoes are not acceptable, only velcro.
- A single release strap (i.e., velco shoe closures tied/strapped to a single handle for quick release) is required on all rowing shoes.
- Shimano type releases is acceptable. However, no heel strap is to be used. Athlete should be prepared to demonstrate the shoe release at the Control Commission.

Full Crew at Starting Line

All boats at the starting line must be fill with appropriate number of rowers, and if required, a coxswain. A crew with a missing rower or coxswain, if required, at the starting line will not be allow to start.

Athlete Substitution

Please use the Athlete Substitution / Change form at the end of this packet if you need to make substitutions for an event during the regatta. Turn in your forms to the clerk as soon as possible.

Scratches

Please use the Scratch form at the end of this packet if you need to make scratches during the regatta. Unless waived by the NWIRA President or Secretary, scratch fees will be assessed to clubs submitting scratches.

Protest

Once an objection is lodged, a crew wishing to be heard before the Jury may fill out a protest form describing the facts that underlie the protest and the relief that the crew seeks to the Chief Umpire or another race official within one hour after reaching on land. The form is available at the Control Commission. Crew submitting a completed protest form shall pay a protest fee (\$100 USD / \$133 CAD) by cash or check.

If the protest is upheld or it is found by the Jury to be substantially justified, the Jury will return the protest fee to the crew. Otherwise, the NWIRA will keep the protest fee.

On-site Concessions and Merchandise Services

Kenora Rowing Club will be providing on-site food service at the boat house. Event t-shirts and memorabilia will also be available for purchases.

Unless authorized by the Kenora Rowing Club and NWIRA, visiting clubs and vendors are not allow to sell foods, beverages, or merchandises at the regatta site.

Awards

- All first place finishers in all events will receive medals.
- All second and third place finishers in all junior events will receive ribbons.

Aggregate Trophies

Aggregate trophies are awarded to the club scoring the most points for:

- Grand Aggregate NWIRA Championship (Sir Thomas Lipton Cup)
- Men's Division Championship (Con' Riley Trophy)
- Women's Division Championship (Henning Peterson Trophy)
- Junior's Division Championship
- Master's Division Championship
- US / Canada Cup US Clubs vs. Canadian Clubs
- Efficiency Championship (CAN-AM Shield)

All clubs, including guest clubs are eligible to earn points for the aggregate trophies.

Participating clubs may have one tent for overnight stay at the regatta site for boat security purposes.


PARKS





Lane 1 is on the north side of lake (between shoreline and first buoy line). Lane 1 through 7 go from the north side to the south side (regatta site side)

Kenora Rowing Club Regatta Site

- The regatta will operate from the Kenora Rowing Club boathouse.
- Vehicles with boat trailers arriving at the regatta site are to drive to their designated area. (See aerial photos below of the boat launch area). Designated sites for boat trailers may be different from aerial photos.
- Be sure to bring plenty of shade tents to keep athletes, coaches, and parents in the shade to reduce the risk of sun overexposure.
- Observe posted speed limit along the road leading to the regatta.
