## IN THE CASE OF AN EMERGENCY

#### CHARGE PERSON:

Malcolm Fletcher 604 562 0125

• Assume command, and direct and control operations until the arrival of the appropriate authorities.

- Work with the Safety Officer to co-ordinate on-water operations,
- Identify him/herself to the authorities; liaise with authorities and direct personnel as necessary.
- Halt the even if there is risk to any participant, or a reduction of safety to all those involved.

#### SAFETY ADVISOR: Wayne Jangula 604-612-3373

- Relays appropriate information to Charge Person
- Locate the injured rower's coach (delegate a volunteer to do this) Quick access to information on each rower is important in the event of emergency
- Designate a control person/s to ensure:
  - That emergency vehicles will be able to access the required location on site
  - Clears any traffic from the entrance/access road before the ambulance arrives
  - Waits at the driveway entrance to direct the ambulance when it arrives

#### CALL PERSON

- Person closest to the situation designated to call 911 for emergency help
- Provide all necessary information to dispatch and stay on the line until emergency responders arrive
- Provide information on the closest access point to the emergency situation:

#### 911 SCRIPT

- Follow the 911 dispatcher's prompts
- "My name is \_\_\_\_\_our regatta is at Blackie's Spit Park, 3136 McBride Avenue, Crescent Beach, Surrey
- "The phone number I am calling from is:\_\_\_\_\_\_
- Describe the nature of the emergency
- Request water rescue if appropriate
- DO NOT HANG UP!!!
- Stay on the line and answer any questions asked by the dispatcher
- Provide dispatch with an alternate phone number in case you're accidently cut off
- Minimize the use of walky-talkies and do not use them when passing confidential information
- Ask the dispatcher how long until the ambulance arrives and provide that information to the Charge Person as soon as possible

#### FIRST AID/MEDICAL EMERGENCIES

- MedVents are the First Aid personnel who will be at the First Aid Tent located on the beach
- First Aid Attendant has a cell phone
- First Aid Attendant may ask for assistance from, or explicitly defer to, someone with more medical training
- Waits with the injured person until Emergency Medical Services arrives and the injured person is transported away from site

#### **ON WATER EMERGENCY**

• Calm judgement must be used in assessing whether a situation is an emergency or is likely to develop into an emergency

## SAFETY BOATS

- Getting injured or unconscious person stabilized and ashore at a site accessible to emergency vehicles takes precedence over all-else. Determine the quickest route to a suitable shore location
- If the injured or unconscious crew is in the water, make sure they have a PFD, and are face-up. It may be necessary to assign another rower to enter the water to assist the injured or unconscious person. Determine and assign the person most qualified to help
- Critical medical emergencies such as rower unconscious, disoriented, or severely injured **call or designate a caller to call 9-1-1** (see 911 script above)
- Follow the 911 dispatcher's prompts
- Have emergency crews meet at the nearest water access point from the list provided at the beginning of this plan
- Ensure Charge Person (Chief Umpire) and Safety Officer are notified

## COMMUNICATION

- Cellphones are the most reliable form of communication on the river. They must be fully charged. It must be in a position that you will hear it if it rings or feel it if it vibrates
- Emergency plan must be in the safety boat and understood by safety boat drivers and spotters
- Emergency Cell Phone numbers list must be correct and in every safety boat

## SAFETY BOAT EQUIPMENT

- The following equipment will be present in each of the safety boats:
  - 4 lifejackets
  - o Heaving line
  - Whistle all the umpires will have a megahorn
  - Bailer or sponge to be used in the event of swamping or a rowing shell taking on a large amount of water.
  - o Blankets silver or other
  - o Ladder
  - Contact numbers of chief umpire, safety officer, other safety boats, regatta chair, regatta office number
  - Paddle(s)
  - o **Toolkit**

#### **INCIDENT REPORT**

Following the conclusion of the events the Safety Officer, Chief Umpire and Regatta Chair, must prepare a report detailing all incidents and actions taken to prevent a recurrence. The appropriate people involved in the emergency or incident should be involved in the writing of this report.
