All events are straight finals. In events with more than 6 entries, the event will be split at the Regatta Chair's discretion, and each race will be considered a final.

#### DAY OF COMPETITION – SCHEDULE INFORMATION

a) Coaches Meeting – Saturday, June 14<sup>th</sup> at 8am at Control Commission.





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**ALL** clubs are required to have at least 1 representative at the coaches meeting, for instructions from the Regatta Chair and Chief Umpire, as per Rule 8.6 of the 2022 RCA Rules of Racing.

As per Rule 8.6 in the Rowing Canada Rules of Racing, the Chief Umpire may penalize a club for failure to attend the coaches meeting, including not permitting the club to race. The Club representative in attendance is responsible for conveying all information from the coaches meeting to all participating athletes and coaches. All participants are expected to be familiar with the information conveyed at the coaches meeting.

Hard copies of the draw will not be distributed. The draw and results will be available online in Regatta Central and through WhatsApp.

- b) Race Times The regatta will start at 9:30am with the Men's 2-. Race intervals will be 10 minutes, unless required to be reduced to a minimum of 5 minutes due to weather, entry numbers, etc. There will be a 30-minute break at 12:30pm for a shift change.
- c) Minimum Race Intervals and Expected Launch Times The minimum race interval will be 5 minutes. Athletes and crews will be permitted to launch no earlier than 45 minutes prior to their posted start time and no later than 20 minutes prior to their posted start time.
- d) Weigh-in Times Weigh-ins will start one hour prior to the first race and be open for 60 minutes. Unless there is a schedule change that results in races starting earlier or later than currently planned (9:30am), weigh-ins will take place between 8:30am and 9:30am. A gauged test scale will be available., Coxswains are not required to weigh-in.
- e) Course practice times The course will be available for practice on Saturday, June 14<sup>th</sup> from 7:00am-8:00am.
- f) Regatta Office Hours Any issues, questions, or concerns can be addressed in-person at the Regatta Office, from 7:00am onward on regatta day, or by calling 905-321-5025. This number will be active from 7:00am to 7:00pm on Friday, June 13<sup>th</sup> and from 6:00am onward on regatta day.
- g) Dryland Warm-Up The on-water race day pattern is not always conducive to a long on-water warm-up. We encourage clubs and/or athletes to bring their own equipment for land warm-ups (ie. Bikes, ergs, etc.). There is ample space in the trailer park and athlete area for this equipment to be set-up. If clubs don't have a tent space, or if the weather doesn't allow, for setting this equipment up outdoors, we will work with clubs to set-up sheltered/indoor spaces.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

All events are open to participants from any Club in the world. Athletes and listed Coaches must be listed on their Club's Regatta Central roster.

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The Henley Masters Age Adjusted Time System will be used. A copy of the Henley Masters Age Adjusted Time System is available on Regatta Central and in Appendix 9 of the 2022 RCA Rules of Racing.

#### ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF PROOF OF AGE AND IDENTITY

As per Rule 2.3, identification will only be accepted if it includes the athlete's birthdate <u>AND</u> photo. If two pieces of identification are required to meet these requirements, competitors are required to show both to the Regatta Chair for verification, prior to presenting at Control Commission. A photo of identification on a cell phone will be accepted, so long as it is clear and has no evidence of tampering.

#### **ENTRY DEADLINES AND PAYMENT TERMS**

All entries and all payment of entry fees will be completed through Regatta Central, without exception. Entries, completed in full, must be submitted online by Sunday, June 8<sup>th</sup> at 11:59PM.

Entries will only be accepted with full payment. Any entries for which payment has not been received will be deleted after the deadline.

A preliminary draw will be posted on Regatta Central on Tuesday, June 10<sup>th</sup>. Any further updates will be published on Regatta Central and Regatta Master, and shared via WhatsApp.

- b) Late Entries Applications for late entries may be submitted through Regatta Central until Friday, June 13<sup>th</sup> at 4pm. Late entries are subject to approval by the Regatta Chair. The cost of a late entry will be 1.5x the cost of the base entry fee, plus seat fees. The late entry fee must accompany the late entry for the entry to be accepted, without exception.
- c) Substitutions Rule 7.6 (Crew Changes Before the First Heat) will apply for all events. The substitute must meet all eligibility and entry requirements as listed above. A \$5.00 Name Change Fee will be assessed for





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all name changes unless a note from a qualified medical professional is emailed to <a href="maileo-kate@rowontario.ca">kate@rowontario.ca</a> by 5:00pm on Monday, June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

#### d) Scratches

All scratches submitted after the entry deadline will be assessed a \$50.00 + HST Scratch fee. The Club whose crews miss the start of their race for any reason will also be assessed a \$50.00 + HST Scratch fee. Scratch fees will be waived for medical reasons if a note from a qualified medical professional is emailed to <a href="mailto:kate@rowontario.ca">kate@rowontario.ca</a> by 5:00pm on Monday, June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

#### RCA RULES OF RACING EXCEPTIONS

This regatta will follow the 2022 Rowing Canada Aviron Rules of Racing, with the exceptions (per Rule 1.6) noted below.

### 2.1 The Definition of a Competitor

 National or Provincial Team exhibition entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Regatta Chair, should the exhibition entry not affect the race schedule. Exhibition entries will not be eligible for medals.

### 2.5 & 2.6 Coxswains Weights & Weighing of Coxswains

• There will be no weighing of coxswains.

#### 9.3 Events with 7 or More Entries

• In events that include multiple age categories (i.e. Women's A-C 4+), if there are enough in each category, the event will be further divided into age categories, and the events will occur in sequence right after the published time. If unable to break into further event age categories, the Regatta Chair will determine the best division to make two or more finals.





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#### **RACING**

An Umpire Boat will follow each race. As per the RCA Rules of Racing, if a crew flips during a race and is able to get back into the boat independently, in a timely fashion, they may choose to finish the race. Should a crew require assistance, from a Safety Boat, Umpire Boat, or otherwise, to get back in their boat, they will be allowed to continue the race, at the discretion of the Race Umpire, as long as their doing so will not interfere with subsequent races.

#### **RESULTS AND MEDALS**

Results will be posted online using Crew Timer and Regatta Master, and shared via WhatsApp and Regatta Central.

1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place medals will be awarded in each of the categories listed in the Event List above. For a gold, silver, and bronze medal to be awarded in a category, there will need to be a minimum of four boats that race in that category. If there are only three boats, only a Gold and Silver will be awarded. If just two boats, only the Gold will be awarded.

#### **PARKING & MOTOR TRAFFIC**

The WIFC North Course is easily accessible and there is ample dedicated space for both participants and trailers. ALL trailers must enter the facility using Shaw Street and park along the east side of Colborne Rd. TRAILERS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO PARK IN THE PARKING LOT.

Cars, including cartoppers are **REQUIRED** to park in the parking lot, allowing space for trailers to park on Colborne St.

PARKING AREAS ARE RESTRICTED AND WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED BY CITY BY-LAW OFFICERS.

#### **SITE AMENITIES**

Please note there will be no food vendors at this regatta. Competitors are encouraged to bring their own water; the municipal water truck will NOT be available for refilling water bottles at this regatta; however, there are taps inside the Athlete Building for refilling bottles. There will be bottles of water available in case of emergency at the Start, Finish, and Medical. There will be ample portable washrooms on the regatta site for the use of athletes, coaches, and regatta volunteers.

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#### **MEDICAL SERVICES**

Medical services will be located on the east side of the Athletes Centre, outside of the boat bays. A secondary location, for more serious cases, will be in the basement of the Athlete Centre.

Any athletes with pre-existing health conditions (ie. asthma, seizure disorder, diabetes, heart condition), which may pose a safety risk to the individual or others on the water, are asked to disclose this information and relevant treatments (ie. inhalers, medications, etc.) to the Chief Umpire, via email (lynda\_dundas@hotmail.com) or in-person prior to racing. This information will be held in confidence by the Chief Umpire and shared only on an as-needed basis with umpires and volunteers (such as the Race Umpire following the athlete's race).
