WELCOME

Dear Athletes and Coaches, please find below Bulletin 2 outlining general information regarding the 2019 RCA Speed-Orders National Selection Regatta. Host, Victoria City Rowing Club, and Regatta Chair, Julien Bahain, welcome you to Elk Lake in Victoria, BC. VCRC's goal is to run a regatta that is fair, safe, and focused on what is best for the athletes. Please see below for information that will assist you with your planning.

AIM

The 2019 Speed Orders National Selection Regatta is an open small boat trial that is compulsory for those interested in being considered for selection onto a 2019 RCA National Team at the following events: **World Rowing Under 23 Championships; Pan American Games; and/or Trans-Tasman U21 Regatta.**

LETTER OF INTENT

Athletes aiming to be considered for a position on a U23, U21 and/or PanAm team should have completed a letter of intent by May 1st, 2019. If this has been neglected please email hp@rowingcanada.org.

ENTRIES

Right of Entry: All athletes shall be Registered participants of an RCA Rowing Club and compete in their Club or University colours. In the Pair events, composite crews may be made up of any combination of athletes representing any Club or University.

Late entries: Entries received after the entry deadline (June 4, 5pm - Pacific) will be considered at the discretion of the Organizing Committee. Late entries will be assessed an additional fee of \$25/entry. NO entries will be accepted after the late entry deadline (June 12th, noon Pacific).

Scratches: Crews scratching after the Entry Deadline (June 4, 5pm Pacific) but by the Scratch/Late Entry Deadline will be assessed a scratch fee of \$25/boat. Crews scratching for non-medical reasons any time after the Scratch/Late Entry Deadline will be assessed a \$100/boat scratch fee. (This includes no-shows).

Entry Fee: Single scull (1x) is \$50 and Pair (2-) is \$100 plus seat fees and GST. All entries must be submitted via the Regatta Central (RC) website. Late entries are an additional \$25/entry.

- Due to the nature of the regatta, athletes may only enter one event.

LIGHTWEIGHTS

At FISA average – Men 70kg; Women 57kg

Weigh-in: One to two hours before the start of your first race of the day, each day you race. If two rounds of the same event take place on the same day of competition (i.e. Reps and Semi-finals) and some rowers in the second round (i.e. Semi-finals) do not have to race in the first round of that day (i.e. Reps), then these rowers in the second round shall be weighed at the same time as the rowers in the first round. A test scale will be available from Wednesday, 10 am. Weigh-ins will take place in the Spracklen Room.

TRAINING BEFORE AND DURING RACING

Training times will be regulated to assist in managing traffic on the lake. The Senior World Cup team will be in Victoria training and the lake is shared with other local crews. Managing training times will allow us to safe training, with good conditions.

 Thursday June 13th : 10am - 12 noon, 2pm-5:00 pm
 Friday, Saturday and Sunday: 6 am-1 hour before the first scheduled race of the day, and
 for 2 hrs, starting 45 minutes after the last scheduled race of the day.

Coaches are asked to provide Safety Boat coverage on Wednesday and Thursday. Please contact Brenda Taylor (clubadmin@vcrc.bc.ca) to book a safety boat.

PROGRESSION

The regatta progression will be a modified FISA World Championship format, with Time Trials in place of Heats. This is the same format as the National Championships. Progression Tables are posted on Regatta Central (https://www.regattacentral.com/v3/cms/regatta/6468/heat_sheet).

A Seeding Panel made up of representatives of the RCA High Performance Staff and participating coaches shall seed the entries in the time trials. The panel will consider Domestic Results, International Results and RADAR scores, seeding up to 10 entries within an event.

PARA CLASSIFICATION - UPDATE

The Para Classification process for athletes will now take place on **June 12th** in the morning at the [Pacific Institute for Sport Excellence](#) (PISE).

BOAT WEIGHING & SAFETY

Boat weighing will take place throughout the Speed Order Regatta. Scales will be open for test weighing on Wednesday June 13 and Thursday June 14 from 10 am-6pm. All athletes are responsible to ensure their boat meets minimum boat weight guidelines as defined in the [RCA Rules of Racing Part #3.2.1](#) and for providing their own weight (if needed). Athletes should note that 'heel ties' and other safety requirements will be checked by umpires throughout the racing period.

BOAT STORAGE

Boats must be stored on boat trailers, or your own 'boat stretchers'.
