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## 1. GENERAL REGATTA INFORMATION

The ROW ONTARIO Masters Championships Regatta is a six-lane 1000m sprint race for Masters-age rowers (21+).

The WIFC North Course in Welland provides a state of the art, fully accessible venue to host a world class regatta. Site amenities include:

- ❖ FinishLynx timing system integrated with RegattaMaster system
- ❖ International-standard Albano buoy system, marked according to FISA standards
- ❖ Grandstand seating at the finish line
- ❖ Officials and athletes building, including indoor changeroom and shower facilities
- ❖ Accessible docks, as well as the ability to comfortably wet-launch
- ❖ Licenced *VIP Terrace*, including a cash bar throughout the afternoon

- ❖ *Athletes' Plaza* and vendor area, including both food and merchandise vendors featuring the 2019 OFFICIAL event merchandise, available at the RegattaSport booth
- ❖ Professional volunteer and facilities management by City of Welland staff

The WIFC North Course is easily accessible for both participants and trailers. **PARKING AREAS ARE RESTRICTED AND WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED BY CITY BY-LAW OFFICERS.** Please refer to the parking map posted on RegattaCentral. Note there is a \$5 Parking Fee, excluding boat transportation vehicles (trailer or car-top).

#### 4. DAY OF COMPETITION - SCHEDULE INFORMATION

a) Coaches meeting - **COACHES MEETING: SUNDAY JULY 14<sup>TH</sup> @ 7:45AM**

A minimum of one representative from each participating Club must attend the Coaches Meeting at 7:45AM on Sunday July 14<sup>th</sup> for instructions from the Regatta Chair and Chief Umpire, as per Rule 8.6 of the 2018 Rules of Racing. Clubs that do not sign in at the coaches meeting may be issued a Yellow Card or may not be permitted to race. The Club representative in attendance is responsible for conveying all information from the coaches meeting to all participating athletes, coaches and spectators. All participants are expected to be familiar with the information conveyed at the coaches meeting.

In an effort to save paper, race draws will not be distributed to participating clubs. Race draws will be posted throughout the venue, and available for viewing in the Regatta Office and online.

b) Race Times

The first race will start at 9:00am. Athletes will be permitted to launch no earlier than 8:15am.

c) Minimum Race Interval and Expected Launch Times

The minimum race interval will be 5 minutes. A 30-minute window will be scheduled before the Mixed 4x's to allow for recovery and support participation in the mixed large boat events. Crews will not be permitted to launch more than 45 minutes or less than 20 minutes before the posted start time of the relevant race.

d) Wet-launch Instructions

Crews who wish to "wet-launch", rather than launch from the designated launch docks, must check in at Control Commission to receive their assigned bow number. Crews using their own bow numbers will be automatically issued a Red Card at the start and will not be permitted to race; ROW ONTARIO-issued bow numbers must be used.

As well, all boats must undergo a safety check prior to launching for each race. Crews who wish to "wet-launch" must have their boats checked by an Umpire prior to launching. Crews that arrive at the start without being checked will be issued a Red Card and will not be permitted to race.

e) Lightweight and Coxswain Weigh-in Times

Weigh-ins will be scheduled in accordance with Rule 2.11 of the 2018 RCA Rules of Racing (2.5 – 1 hour before the first scheduled Lightweight event that day).

There will be no calibrated test scale available. Coxswains are not required to weigh in.

f) Course Practice Times

The course will be open for practice on **Saturday July 13<sup>th</sup> 4:00pm – 6:00pm** and **Sunday July 14<sup>th</sup> 6:30am – 7:30am**.

There must be a minimum safety boat to crew ratio of 1:4 on the water during practice times, and safety boats and crews may not go past the start gates during practice times. Safety boat drivers must be provided by the clubs, and safety boat drivers and crews must sign in at the Regatta Office before launching for practice. Any crew practicing without a designated safety boat will be issued a Yellow Card when they check in to Control Commission for their first event. The Course will only be open for practice if weather and water conditions permit, at the discretion of the Regatta Chair, Chief Umpire or Associate Chief Umpire.

g) Regatta Office Hours

Saturday July 14<sup>th</sup>: 4:00pm – 6:00pm

Sunday July 15<sup>th</sup>: 6:00am – 30 minutes after the last race

## 5. PROGRESSION FORMAT

All events are straight finals. In events with more than 6 entries, the event will be split at the Regatta Chair's discretion and each race will be considered a final.

## 6. ELIGIBILITY

All events are open to participants from any Club in the world. Athletes and listed coaches must be listed on their Club's RegattaCentral roster.

Clubs with outstanding fees (including but not limited to Club Membership, athlete registration, entry fees, seat fees) not paid by 7:00am on Sunday July 14<sup>th</sup> will not be permitted to race in any event.

i) Parent-Child 2x	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Parent-Child 2x must include a parent and child who both fulfill the eligibility criteria related to active registration, but are not required to be registered members at the same rowing club</li> </ul>

## 8. ENTRY DEADLINES AND PAYMENT TERMS

All entries and all payment of entry fees will be completed through RegattaCentral, unless otherwise stated. Entries, completed in full, must be submitted online by 4:59pm on Monday July 8<sup>th</sup>.

Entries for the Parent-Child 2x event will be accepted at the Regatta Office until 1 hour before the posted race time. Late entry fees will not apply in this event.

Entries will only be accepted with full payment. Any entries for which payment has not been received after the deadline will be deleted.

A preliminary race draw will be posted on RegattaCentral on July 9<sup>th</sup>, 2019.

### b) Late Entries

Late entries will be accepted on a first come, first paid basis. Late entries are subject to lane availability. Late entries will be accepted during the following times:

c) Late Entry Fees

Late entry fee = regular entry fee + 50%. The late entry fee must accompany the late entry for the late entry to be accepted, without exception. Late entry fees must be paid by cash, club cheque or credit card. Personal cheques will not be accepted.

d) Substitutions

Rule 7.6 (Crew changes before the First Heat) will apply to all crew substitutions. The substitute must meet all eligibility and entry requirements as listed above.

A \$5.00 Name Change Fee will be assessed for all name changes, unless a note from a qualified medical professional is emailed to [andrea@rowontario.ca](mailto:andrea@rowontario.ca) by 5:00pm on Monday July 15<sup>th</sup>.

e) Scratches

All scratches submitted after the entry deadline will be assessed a \$50.00 Scratch Fee. Crews who miss the start of their race for **any** reason will also be assessed a \$50.00 Scratch Fee. Scratch Fees will be waived for medical reasons if a note from a qualified medical professional is emailed to [andrea@rowontario.ca](mailto:andrea@rowontario.ca) by 5:00pm on Monday July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2019.

## 9. RCA RULES OF RACING EXCEPTIONS

This regatta will follow the 2018 Rowing Canada Aviron Rules of Racing, with the Exceptions (per Rule 1.6) noted below:

### 2.1 The Definition of a Competitor

- National or Provincial Team exhibition entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Regatta Chair. Exhibition entries will not be eligible for medals.
- Composite entries composed of members from multiple Clubs will be permitted if each individual member fulfills the eligibility requirements listed above.

### 2.3 Categories of Rowers and Proof of Age and Identity

- In lieu of a single piece of government issued photo identification, the following alternatives will be accepted:
  - Clear and legible photograph of government-issued photo identification, either a photocopy or digital version;
  - Two pieces of ID, one of which is government-issued, that together confirm date of birth and identity (photo);
  - ROWONTARIO Regatta ID\*.

**\*ROWONTARIO Regatta ID** is available for purchase on-site for \$20+HST. Competitors must produce two pieces of documentation, or clear and legible photographs thereof, that when combined confirm name and date of birth.

### 2.6 Weighing of Coxswains

- Coxswains will not be weighed at this regatta.

### 2.8 Masters Age Adjusted Time System

- The Henley Masters Age Adjusted Time System will be used. A copy of the Henley Masters Age Adjusted Time System is available on RegattaCentral and in Appendix 5 of the 2018 RCA Rules of Racing.

### 2.11 Weighing of Athletes in Weight Restricted Events

- Calibrated test scales will not be provided by the organizing committee at any point.

## 6.4 Tobacco and Liquor Products

- There will be a celebration garden with beer and wine, where there may be advertising of beer or wine products.

## 7.2 Entries

- The name of the crew coach must be included with each entry.

## 9.3 Events with 7 or More Entries

- Events with 7 or more entries will be run as multiple finals, as outlined above.

## 10. RESULTS AND MEDALS

All events are straight finals. In events with 7 or more entries, the event will be split at the Regatta Chair's discretion and each race will be considered a final.

Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be awarded to the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place finishers in races with 4 or more entries.

Gold and Silver medals will be awarded to the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place finishers in races with 3 entries.

Gold medals only will be awarded to the 1<sup>st</sup> place finisher in races with 2 entries.

Medals will be awarded at the medal podium at the grandstands by a ROWONTARIO representative. Medal presentations are not scheduled; participants are invited to pick up their medal whenever convenient throughout the regatta.

Points will be awarded based on the results of an athlete's earliest 1x race of the day and applied to the appropriate Trillium Chase category, using the birth date entered at time of registration. All competing athletes who compete in a 1x event will be awarded points regardless of the number of participants in that Trillium Chase age category.
