3. ENTRY FEES AND DEADLINES

Varsity events: \$475 per gender Development events: \$300 per gender

Entry Deadline: October 18th 11:59PM

All entries will be complete using Regatta Central. An entry is only valid when all crew members are named and entry fee payment is submitted.

A complete team roster of all athletes eligible to compete in the OUA rowing championships shall be input to Regatta Central by October 18th 11:59PM. Only athletes listed on the roster may compete or be used as a spare or substitute in any entry for any reason.

Substitutions: After entries close, and prior to racing beginning, a maximum of 50% of a crew or the single may be substituted from the original team roster. Name changes may be submitted via email to Andrea Miller (andrea@rowontario.ca) by October 23rd at 11:59PM. Any additional name changes will need to be made in person at the OUA Coaches Meeting for a fee of \$5 per name, except for medical reasons validated by medical documentation before the end of the regatta. An athlete who has been medically replaced will not be allowed to compete in any event on that same day.

OUA Eligibility Deadline: October 15th11:59PM

Coaches must submit the URL to their sport specific roster to Taylor Curran, OUA Sport Operations Coordinator (taylor.curran@oua.ca) and the championship convenor Andrea Miller, ROWONTARIO Competitions Manager (andrea@rowontario.ca). Any changes to the roster occurring within 24 hours of racing can only be done for medical reasons or on compassionate grounds. All requests are to be submitted for approval by the OUA Sport Operations Coordinator and the Regatta Chair.

4. TEAM REGISTRATION AND ELIGIBILITY

Heats for Saturday's Championship event finals will begin immediately following the completion of the last Development race.

Saturday October 28th: Finals for the Championship events will begin at 9:00AM. Events will run in 15-minute intervals, with race intervals of no less than 6 minutes.

The official weigh-in for all lightweights and coxswains will be held starting 2 hours prior to the first lightweight race and shall remain open for 2.5 hours for each racing day.

7. SPORT SPECIFIC RULES AND OFFICIALS

Certified RCA Umpires will supervise all races.

The OUA Rowing Championships will be hosted and staged according to the 2013 RCA Rules of Racing, with the following exceptions:

- 2.6& 2.11 All coxswains and lightweight athletes will weigh in each day the scales will open 2 hours prior to the first lightweight event and stay open for 2.5 hours each racing day
- 6.0 the OUA does not monitor the size or number of advertising on equipment or uniforms during the Championships
- 6.5 the OUA does not track the use of blades that do not match the schools colors
- 9.3 the regatta does not use the repechage system in the progression of crews
- 10.9 Damage in the Start zone: There will be no stoppage of races for equipment broken while in the start zone and there will be no delay in the start time for crews who have equipment issues prior to their scheduled race time.
- 10.15 Dead Heat: if in a heat there is a dead heat for a qualifying position and room is available in the next round of progression then all crews will be advanced. If there is no room available then a re-row with those crews involved will take place.

Coxswains requiring deadweight will be expected to purchased sand from the weigh-in room for \$5.00 fee.

The number of volunteers will be based upon the number of varsity entries each school submits, based on the following ratios:

1-3 varsity entries: 1 volunteer
4-8 varsity entries: 2 volunteers
9-12 varsity entries: 3 volunteers
13-16 varsity entries: 4 volunteers
17-20 varsity entries: 5 volunteers
