### ROWONTARIO TRILLIUM CHASE 1x CHALLENGE SERIES – GENERAL INFORMATION

The Trillium Chase is a monthly 1x Challenge Series – a single sculler's 'Grand Prix' – organized by ROWONTARIO. Each month, single scullers of all ages will have the opportunity to earn points toward the ROWONTARIO Trillium Cup, which will be co-awarded to the male and female sculler, regardless of age category, who wins the most points throughout the Series.

### **REGATTA INFORMATION**

The Trillium Sprints is a 500m single elimination format regatta racing out of the protected boat slip at Bayfront Park. Scullers will race a 500m Time Trial to start the day, which will seed them into the bracket. Scullers will then race head-to-head 500m races, with the winner advancing through the Championship Bracket until an overall winner is determined. If entries warrant, a Consolation Bracket will also be raced to maximize the number of races per athlete.

#### **DAY OF COMPETITION - SCHEDULE INFORMATION**

Bayfront Park is an approximately 1000m row west of Leander Boat Club and has its own parking lot for easy spectator access. All athletes will rig in the Leander Boat Club parking lot, launch from the Leander Boat Club docks, and return to Leander Boat Club at the end of the day. All racing will be at Bayfront Park; please refer to the map for the staging area.

#### **ATHLETE REGISTRATION: 7:00AM-7:45AM**

Location: Leander Boat Club Member's Lounge (50 Leander Drive)

Athlete Identification will be checked at registration between 7:00AM-7:45AM and bow numbers assigned. Athletes will use the same bow number all day for all races.

### **IMPORTANT: I.D. REQUIREMENTS**

All competitors will be required to show proof of age and identity during registration to receive a bow number. Identification will only be accepted if it includes the athlete's birthdate <u>and</u> photo. A photograph of ID on a phone will be accepted, so long as it is clear. If an athlete needs to use multiple pieces of ID to fulfill the requirements, that is also acceptable (e.g., a student card + health card).

#### **PARTICIPANTS MEETING: 8:00AM**

Location: Leander Boat Club Member's Lounge

ALL participants (athletes and coaches) are required to attend participants meeting at 8:00AM for instructions from the Regatta Chair and Chief Umpire, as per Rule 8.6 in the RCA Rules of Racing. Athletes may be given a Yellow Card or excluded from racing if not present at the participants meeting, at the Chief Umpire's discretion.

The first race will start at 9:00AM. Athletes will launch from the Leander Boat Club docks and row to the staging area at Bayfront Park. Boats will only be checked once at Leander Boat Club and a coloured zip tie attached to the bow ball; athletes will not be permitted to race if this zip tie is removed throughout the day.





#### **PROGRESSION FORMAT**

#### **Time Trials:**

Athletes will be grouped by Category for the Time Trials. Within each category, athletes will be seeded first by Trillium Chase points, then randomly by the Regatta Manager. Time Trials will run at 30 second intervals in a single lane.

#### **Knock-Out Bracket:**

Athletes will be placed into a single-elimination bracket based on placing in the Time Trial, beginning 45 minutes after the end of the last time trial. The actual bracket will be determined by the number of entries and will be posted once entries close in each registration window.

#### Course Practice Times

There will be no practice times available on the course prior to racing.

### Regatta Office Hours

The Regatta Office will open at 6:30AM at the Leander Boat Club Member's Lounge for late registrations. Once athletes have launched, the Regatta Office will be located at Control Commission for the remainder of the regatta.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

- Ontario athletes: be a registered member of a ROWONTARIO member club in good standing, as well as registered with ROWONTARIO and RCA;
- Canadian athletes from outside Ontario: be a registered member of an RCA rowing club in good standing, as well as registered with the appropriate PRA and RCA;
- Athletes from outside Canada: be a registered member of a rowing club, which is a member of its National Rowing Federation.

#### Scratches

All scratches submitted after the entry deadline will be assessed a \$50 Scratch Fee.

Crews who miss the start of their race for any reason will also be assessed a \$50 Scratch Fee.

Scratch Fees will be waived for medical reasons if a note from a qualified medical professional is presented to the ROWONTARIO Office by 4:00PM on Monday October 22<sup>nd</sup>.

### RCA RULES OF RACING EXCEPTIONS

This regatta will follow the 2018 Rowing Canada Aviron Rules of Racing, with the Exceptions (per Rule 1.6) below:

#### 2.7 Masters Rowers

ROWONTARIO has established its own categories for the Trillium Chase 1x Challenge Series, as outlined above.

#### 2.8 Master's Age Adjustment Time Systems

The Trillium Chase 1x Challenge Series does not use age-adjusted times for Masters rowers.

#### 2.12 Para Competitors

Para rowers should meet the FISA Para Rowing Classification Regulations but will not be required to be classified for this competition.

#### 3.1 Classes of Boats

PR3 1x entries will be accepted.





#### 4.1 Length, Marking and Number of Lanes of Course

The course will not be marked each 250 metres. There will be a buoy at the start and finish lines. The course will only have two lanes.

#### 4.2 Stretches of Water – Standard Course

The course is not a standard course; the race course itself is only 500m long. There is sufficient run out area beyond the finish; however, in the case of bad weather, crews will be instructed to stop immediately after finishing and complete a warm-up loop back to the start as indicated in the weather contingency plan.

#### 8.8 Other Boats on the Water

The boat launch has been reserved through the City of Hamilton, and every effort will be made to prevent other boats from launching at the boat slip. However, Bayfront Park is a public boat launch site.

#### 9.1 General

Each round of the single elimination bracket will be begin 15 minutes following the finish of the preceding round.

#### 9.2.1 Row Over

If circumstances arise where a crew is the only boat at the starting line, the crew will not be required to race but will be granted a bye in that round and automatically progress to the next round.

#### 9.3 Events with 7 or more Entries

The Trillium Sprints regatta will use a single elimination bracket.

#### **Appendix 1 – Progression System Options**

Crews receiving a "bye" will not be required to launch and row the course at race pace.

#### Appendix 8 – Time Trial Rules

- **2.1** The minimum time between boats will be 30 seconds.
- **2.5** Each athlete will be assigned a unique bow number and will use that bow number throughout the entire regatta. Lanes will be assigned within the bracket.

#### **RESULTS**

Results will be posted on-site throughout the day at Control Commission, as well as on the ROWONTARIO Twitter feed (@ROWONTARIO). Final results will be posted on RegattaCentral and the ROWONTARIO website.





#### **POINTS**

Athletes will be awarded points toward the **ROWONTARIO Trillium Cup** based on their age category, as defined above, using the results of the 500m Time Trial.

Points are awarded based on the fastest time in that age category. All competing athletes who complete the race will be awarded points regardless of the number of entries in a category.

#### **MEDALS**

There will be no medals presented. Please note that athletes will only be eligible if they have completed in a minimum of 3 Trillium Chase challenges, including at least 1 of the Trillium Kick-Off, Muskoka Poker Run or the Trillium Sprints.

#### **PARKING**

Please check RegattaCentral for the regatta parking plan. Parking is available at Leander Boat Club and Bayfront Park; however, both parking lots are public lots and it is not possible to reserve either parking lot, so parking will be on a first-come, first-served basis.

#### **SITE AMENITIES**

There are washrooms and changerooms available at Leander Boat Club in the boathouse. The Member's Lounge will be locked between the Coaches Meeting and the end of the regatta, but participants are welcome to keep personal items there if necessary. There is a public washroom at Bayfront Park. There is water available at Leander Boat Club, but no accessible water supply at Bayfront Park. There will be bottled water at Control Commission and the





Medical tent in case of emergency, but participants are encouraged to bring their own water and food.
