The Canada Cup Regatta aims to show-case Canadian rowing in a sprint format that creates athlete participation through an exciting race program and athlete interaction and encourages spectator and sponsor engagement. Entries for the Canada Cup Regatta are structured to promote inclusion of athletes from all regions.

# ELIGIBILITY

- The Canada Cup Regatta shall be open to athletes who represent a Provincial Rowing Association (PRA).
- As per the Canadian Amateur Rowing Association's (CARA) Constitution and RCA's Registration Policy, an athlete entering the Canada Cup Regatta is required to be registered with RCA and their PRA through an RCA Member Club prior to an entry being made for the athlete. If the RCA Member Club provided by the athlete does not correspond with the RCA database at the time entries are cross-checked, the athlete's Club and PRA in the database will be used in making the regatta draw and any subsequent race results. If no club or PRA affiliation is found in the database, the entry will not be drawn.
- PRA's shall pay their respective entry fees.

- Athletes shall race in their respective PRA colours. Neutral or Club painted oars are acceptable by agreement of the Chief Umpire, however oars must be uniform in colour within a crew.
- **Close of Entries:** Entries for the Canada Cup will close on August 4<sup>th</sup> at 11:59PM EDT. Late entries will be accepted after this date at the discretion of both by the LOC and RCA.
- **Team Size and Age limits:** Each PRA team shall be a maximum of 8 Men and 8 Women, plus 1 coxswain of any gender.
- Canada Cup athletes shall be under 21 years. A rower or coxswain may compete as an Under 21 competitor until the 31st of December of the year in which they reach the age of 20.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

- Coaches meetings will be held at 7PM each day from Monday August 11<sup>th</sup> to Friday August 15<sup>th</sup> located in the cafeteria of Ontario Hall at Western University. Coaches meetings will also be held at 7AM on Thursday through Saturday to review weather conditions and any crew changes. All other communication will be disseminated via the Canada Cup What's App group linked below.
- Racing will start at 8:30AM each day.
- Crews will be allowed on the water 40 min before their race time.
- Original government issued photo ID will be required at control commission and weigh-ins
- Heats and Finals take place at 15 minute intervals for 2k races, 10 minute intervals for 1k races and 5 minute intervals for 500m races.

- Drivers are not allowed to park in the designated trailer areas unless a trailer is attached to the vehicle or shell(s) are strapped to a car.
- When parking trailers and tow vehicles, point them toward the lake to exit the site properly (use lower road).
- Entries are to be submitted via Regatta Central.
- Online Name Change Deadline August 12 at noon EDT.
- Post-entries are allowed up to the morning coaches meeting if they do not force additional heats or finals and subject to approval by both LOC and RCA.
- All crew changes must be communicated in writing to the Organizing Committee no later than the morning coaches meeting.

- Training time 30 minutes after last race until 3PM

Friday, August 15th Regatta Day 2 for the following events:

- Men's 2x, 4- (1000m)
- Women's 2x, 4- (1000m)
- Training time 30 minutes after last race until 3PM

Saturday, August 16<sup>th</sup> [1] Regatta Day 3 for the following events:

- Men 4x, 8+(500m)
- Women 4x, 8+ (500m)
- Awards presentation one hour after last race

Saturday, August 16<sup>th</sup> PM, Teams depart. Please inform the LOC if accommodations are needed for Saturday night.

\*\*\*Starting system will be in place for 2000 meter racing. For 1000 meter and 500 meter racing a floating start will be used.\*\*\*

### PROGRESSION

- For events with more than <u>6</u> entries, placing during heats determine the finalists. The top finisher from 2 heats will move on, then next fastest times. Points will be awarded for the top finisher from each PRA. Remaining boats will be moved to the B final.
- For events with 6 entries or less, a race for lanes will take place
- For events with 7 entries, there will be no B final as the 7<sup>th</sup> place finisher will be automatically allocated the 7<sup>th</sup> ranking.

## POINTS

- Points shall be awarded for each Canada Cup event in each A Final as follows: 1st place in each event: 6 points for each rower's Province (excluding coxswains)
- 2nd place in each event: 5 points for each rower's Province (excluding coxswains)
- **3rd place in each event:** 4 points for each rower's Province (excluding coxswains)
- 4th place in each event: 3 points for each rower's Province (excluding coxswain
- **5th place in each event:** 2 points for each rower's Province (excluding coxswains)
- 6th place in each event: 1 point for each rower's Province (excluding coxswains)
- \*\* Winners of the overall Provincial point-score, will be awarded the 'Canada Cup' trophy.

# PRACTICE TIME AND SCHEDULE

- Between August 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>, facilities will be open to practice between 8 and 3PM. Transportation times will correspond with open practice times.
- A coach must be on the water in a safety boat while their crews are practicing. Coaches from participating PRAs must volunteer to act as safety boats during the practice time, or the course will remain closed. Coach boats, fuel, safety equipment will be provided by the LOC.
- No megaphones are permitted during practice hours

# COXWAINS AND WEIGH IN RULES

- All coxswains must weigh in.
- Coxswain weigh-in will occur from two hours to one hour before the start of coxswain's first race
- Coxswains must weigh in accompanied by a coach.
- In the case of any dispute, the umpire will communicate with the crew's coach or PRA official only.
- Coxswains will weigh in wearing their racing uniform. No one will be weighed in wearing more or less clothing.
- All weights for coxswains requiring extra weight will be supplied at the scales and will be the only weights recognized by umpires.
- A test scale will be open and made available.
- The minimum weight for a coxswain at the Canada Cup regatta will be 45kg.
- Photo ID will be requested.
- Weigh ins will occur on a first come first served basis, based upon when you report to the weigh in room.
- Any verbal abuse of umpires will result in disciplinary action as outlined in the RCA Rules of Racing and RCA Safe Sport policy.
- Coxswains may cox crews from other Provinces.

# RULES OF RACING

The RCA Rules of Racing will apply at this regatta. Exceptions to the RCA Rules of Racing are as follows:

- Rule 2.5 Coxswain Weights The minimum weight for a coxswain is 45 kg.
  Rule 11.16.6 Zonal Umpiring will be used for 500m racing

# PARKING

Transportation will be provided to coaches and athletes from all PRA between Ontario Hall and the Doug Wells Rowing Centre. Parking is restricted to the designed areas. Please be prepared to walk from the designated areas. All other space around the boathouse will be reserved for umpires and volunteers. Only trailer tow vehicles or vehicles that are car topping boats will be allowed on the paths around the boathouse. These paths will be clearly marked and should be left open for emergency vehicles.

# BUS DROP OFF

Bus drop off and pickup will occur a short distance away from the boathouse and boat park. This is to allow busses ample room to turn and remove traffic from emergency lanes. Participants should be prepared to walk a short distance to the boat park area from the bus drop off point.

# TRAILER PARKING

Spots for trailer parking will be marked off. The designated spots for each trailer will be staked off. We will also be designating certain areas for vehicles with boats on them.



#### ACCOMMODATIONS

Western University is excited to host Provincial rowing teams from across the country. Athletes, coaches and managers will be housed in our most energy efficient, LEED Certified Residence, Ontario Hall.

### TRANSPORTATION
