1. GENERAL REGATTA INFORMATION

TRILLIUM CHASE 1x CHALLENGE SERIES

The Trillium Chase is a monthly 1x Challenge Series – a single sculler's 'Grand Prix' – organized by ROWONTARIO. Each month, single scullers of all ages will have the opportunity to earn points toward The Trillium Cup, which will be co-awarded to the male and female sculler, regardless of category, who wins the most points throughout the Series.

Athletes who complete **CHALLENGE #1: THE TRILLIUM BUY-IN,** will receive a discounted entry fee for the **Trillium Stake Race!**

RACE DETAILS

The Trillium Stake Race is a 1850m Time Trial, where single scullers will need to complete TWO 180 degree turns around two stakes / buoys. Scullers will be sent off at intervals of 30 seconds.

Please refer to the race course map for important information regarding the warm-up and racing traffic patterns, including no-passing zones and marshalling areas.

Note: Athletes are always required to follow the traffic pattern to ensure their own safety and that of their fellow competitors. Athletes who do not follow the designated warm-up and racing traffic patterns will be assessed a 30-second time penalty and may be required to stop rowing before safely resuming racing on the designated race course. Athletes who violate the NO PASSING ZONES or fail to yield, as instructed by the Race Umpires, will be given a Red Card and excluded from the results.

VENUE INFORMATION

The Trillium Stake Race will take place at the Argonaut Rowing Club, 1225 Lakeshore Blvd W. Toronto, ON. You will need to enter the parking lot (for the rowing club) while traveling EAST bound. You are unable to enter the parking if traveling west bound on Lakeshore Blvd and will need to turn around.

Parking lot space is reserved closest to the boathouse for boat unloading and storage. There will be free parking in the upper municipal parking lot. Please refer to maps for specifics.

The maps included in this package are accurate as of the date this Regatta Package was created and may need to be updated based on relevant changes to the host venue, in consultation with the Chief Umpire. Please refer to RegattaCentral for the most recent maps.

3. EVENT LIST

Athletes will race with their age category (as defined below). The order in which age categories will race will be randomly determined, and age categories will be assigned to groups after entries close and posted in the final draw.

Women will race first, followed by the men, 40 minutes later.

4. DAY OF COMPETITION - SCHEDULE INFORMATION

COACH AND ATHLETE MEETING: 8:00AM

COACHES AND ATHLETE MEETING

ALL coaches and athletes are required to attend the coach <u>and</u> athlete meeting at **8:00AM** for instructions from the Regatta Chair and Chief Umpire. *Athletes will not be given a bow number if they do not check in at the meeting.*

REGATTA START TIME

The first race will start at 9:00AM. Athletes will be permitted to launch no earlier than 8:30AM.

The minimum race interval will be 40 minutes between men's and women's events. The women will be the first to race at 9:00AM.

COURSE PRACTICE TIMES

There is no practice before the regatta. Athletes will be able to warm up on water before the start of their race.

REGATTA OFFICE HOURS

The regatta office (on the dock) will be open at 6:45AM. Late entries will not be accepted after 7:15AM.

5. ELIGIBILITY

- Ontario participants: Be a registered member of a ROWONTARIO member club and registered with ROWONTARIO and RCA;
- Canadian participants from outside Ontario;



 International participants: Be a registered member of your national rowing association (e.g., USROWING).

6. ENTRY DEADLINES AND PAYMENT TERMS

All entries and all payment of entry fees will be completed through <u>RegattaCentral</u>, without exception. Entries, completed in full, must be submitted online by <u>April 28th, 2019</u> at <u>11:59PM(EST)</u>

Entries will only be accepted with full payment. Any entries for which payment has not been received after the deadline will be deleted.

The race draw will be posted on RegattaCentral on April 29th, 2019.

SUBSTITUATIONS

There are no substitutions allowed. You will be required to submit a new entry if wishing to race.



SCRATCHES

All scratches submitted after the entry deadline will be assessed a \$50 Scratch Fee.

Crews who miss the start of their race for any reason will also be assessed a \$50 Scratch Fee.

Scratch Fees will be waived for medical reasons if a note from a qualified medical professional is presented to the Regatta Manger by May 5th, 2019. (events@argonautrowingclub.com)

7. RCA RULES OF RACING EXCEPTIONS

This regatta will follow the 2018 Rowing Canada Aviron Rules of Racing, with the Exceptions (per Rule 1.6) below:

2.3 Categories of Rowers and Proof of Age and Identity

Please see the chart above for the event age categories.

A birth certificate or other government issued documentation without a photo will be acceptable for Under 13 and Under 15 athletes **only**. All other athletes will be required to show proof of age and identity by producing government issued documentation with photo.

2.7 Masters Rowers

Please see the chart above for the event age categories.

2.8 Masters Age-Adjusted Time Scores

Times will not be age-adjusted within each category.

4.2 Stretches of Water – Standard Course

Not a standard race course. The racing distance is not equal to the race course and requires single scullers to complete two 180 degree turns to reach full race distance.

Appendix 8 Rule 2.1 Racing Rules

The minimum time between boats will be 30 seconds, not one minute.

8. RESULTS AND POINTS

Full results will be post on RegattaCental

Athletes will be awarded points based on their category, as defined above, **not** based on the event entered at each specific regatta. Points are awarded based on the fastest time in that category, based on the parameters outlined in this regatta package for each individual regatta.

Within 0.1-0.9% of Fastest Time	22 points
Within 1-1.9% of Fastest Time	18 points
Within 2-2.9% of Fastest Time	15 points
Within 3-3.9% of Fastest Time	12 points
Within 4-4.9% of Fastest Time	10 points
Within 5-5.9 % of Fastest Time	7 point
Within 6% or greater of Fastest Time	5 point
Did not race	0 points

An athlete's points total and standing, within his/her category as well as overall standings, will be updated after each event in the Series and published on the Trillium Chase page on ROWONTARIO's website.
